



## TUITION FEES POLICY

### HOME STUDENTS

Full time home students under 19 on 1st September 2011 may enrol at the College without payment of fees.

### LEARNERS ELIGIBLE FOR FUNDING

For funding eligibility purposes, the EEA (European Economic Area) is defined as all members of the EU and Iceland, Liechtenstein, Switzerland and Norway. A student who on the start date of the course has been ordinarily resident in the UK for the three years preceding the start date, and whose main purpose for such residence was not to receive full-time education during any part of the three year period.

Students who do not fulfil this condition will be charged at the International Rate unless they fall into one of the specific groups listed below:

### INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS

Tuition fees for an International Student starting a full-time course in September 2011 will be charged at the following rate:

**A 3 AS/A level course will be charged at £4500 per annum**

**A 4 AS/A level course will be charged at £5500 per annum**

### ELIGIBILITY

In addition consideration will also be given to the following groups of 16-18 year old learners for funding:

- 16-18 year olds who are accompanying or joining parents who have the right of abode or leave to enter or remain in the UK, or those who are children of diplomats.
- 16-18 year olds who are dependants of teachers coming to the UK on a teacher-exchange scheme.
- 16-18 year olds entering the UK (where not accompanied by their parents) who are British citizens, or 16-18 year olds whose passports have been endorsed to show they have the right of abode in this country.
- All 16-18 year old asylum seekers
- All 16-18 year old learners (including unaccompanied asylum seekers) who are placed in the care of social services.
- Consideration will also be given in exceptional circumstances. Where the College believes that a learner should be considered for funding under exceptional circumstances, the College will contact the YPLA.
