

FAQs (frequently asked questions) Results & Post Results Services

Q Can I speak to my subject teacher or Form Tutor about my results?

A Teaching staff are on holiday until college opens for enrolment on 30th August, though some teachers/tutors *may* be contactable via email and happy to respond, however there is not an expectation to do so.

Q Can I find out how many marks away from the next grade I was for my subjects?

A Grade boundary information is released by exam boards at the same time as the results via their websites

Q If I am not happy with my results should I get a copy of my exam papers before getting them reviewed?

A If you are waiting for your university place to be agreed then advice would be to go straight to having you're a priority review of marking. If you get your paper back first you could miss the university or UCAS deadline.

If you are not waiting for a place then you have plenty of time to see your paper before the deadline for an ordinary review.

Q Can I get my exams re-marked?

A You can have your paper *reviewed* but they will not re-mark it. A different examiner will look to see if the original examiner has made a mistake - they will only change marks if a mistake is identified.

Q Will the university where I hope to go automatically know I am having a paper reviewed?

A No, you must inform them that you are having a review of marking so they hold a place open for you in case your marks change.

Q How will I be told my exam paper has come back?

A You can see via Exams/Services/Details on your portal when a script has come back as it will be attached there.

Q How will I be told if my mark/grade has changed?

A The exam boards send a letter electronically to say if a mark or grade has been changed. The letter will be attached to your portal in the same way a script is, and if a mark change has affected your grade it will show on the Results detailed below.
