Network Manager

The College

The College is actually situated just outside Esher, in attractive grounds in Thames Ditton, and is well served by public transport. Thames Ditton rail station is two minutes walk away and Esher rail station about 12 minutes. Both provide a direct link to central London. The core business of the College is the full-time education of 16-18 year old students, all of whom study level 3 courses. Within this context, the College has an inclusive, open access approach, recruiting students from over 100 different schools in North Surrey and the London boroughs. The result is a rich and diverse student population. Applicants from the three most local postcodes, from schools without sixth forms in a defined geographical area and from siblings of current and former students all have guaranteed status. Incidentally, of all application categories, siblings consistently give us the highest conversion of applicant to enrolment. Those who know us best are most likely to come. All other applicants have open status and places are allocated by ballot.

The College has a strong reputation in the area and is highly over-subscribed, with applications closing 9 months before enrolment begins. Its popularity is principally based on academic achievement and successful progression, as well as a more mature and informal learning environment which lays the foundations for future success. Despite relatively modest entry requirements, it has an established track record in delivering impressive examination results. As a result, it was judged 'outstanding' by Ofsted for all areas inspected in 2005 and 2008. As with all 'outstanding' providers, the College has been exempt from inspection in recent years. However, this exemption has been lifted and an inspection is expected imminently. We experienced an unprecedented increase in the conversion rate at the start of this academic year, for which there are numerous possible explanations. As a result, the College had 2092 students on roll at enumeration – a few more than originally planned!

The College is firmly rooted in its local (and residential) community. Outside of core hours, the facilities are offered for evening lettings (including a new, in-demand 3G pitch) as part of its commitment to the community it serves. The College is a recognised centre of excellence for accredited counselling and life skills courses for adults. Both lettings and adult learning provide additional, non-ESFA income.

The Post

As IT Network Manager, you will not only lead the IT Support team but also serve as a trusted resource, supporting and training staff and students.
