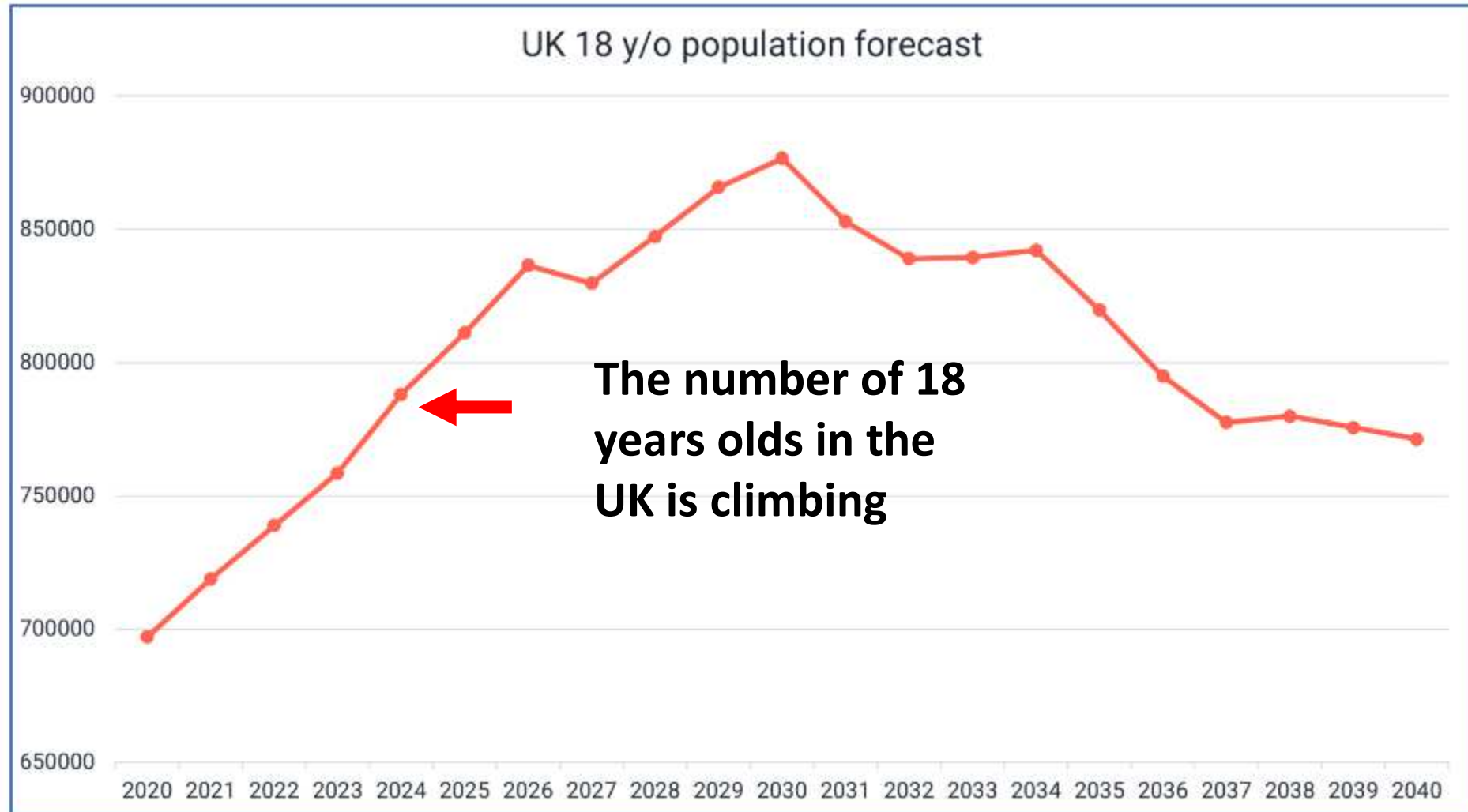

The current Higher Education climate



The current HE climate

- UCAS tells us there will be 45,000 extra applications each year until 2030
- Project 'Journey to a Million" [What is the journey to a million? | Undergraduate | UCAS](#)
- It is likely that university applications will gradually becoming more competitive
- Downwards pressure – cost of living pressures
- UCAS applications data from the 2023 cycle: **757,060** applications in total (down 1.2%)
- Competition for places at top universities will remain as hard as ever
- It is still a very good time to apply to university!

Why Go To Uni?

- There are many careers which still require a degree
- Graduates earn more: HESA reports an average graduate starting salary of **£27,340**
- You enjoy studying and want to continue!

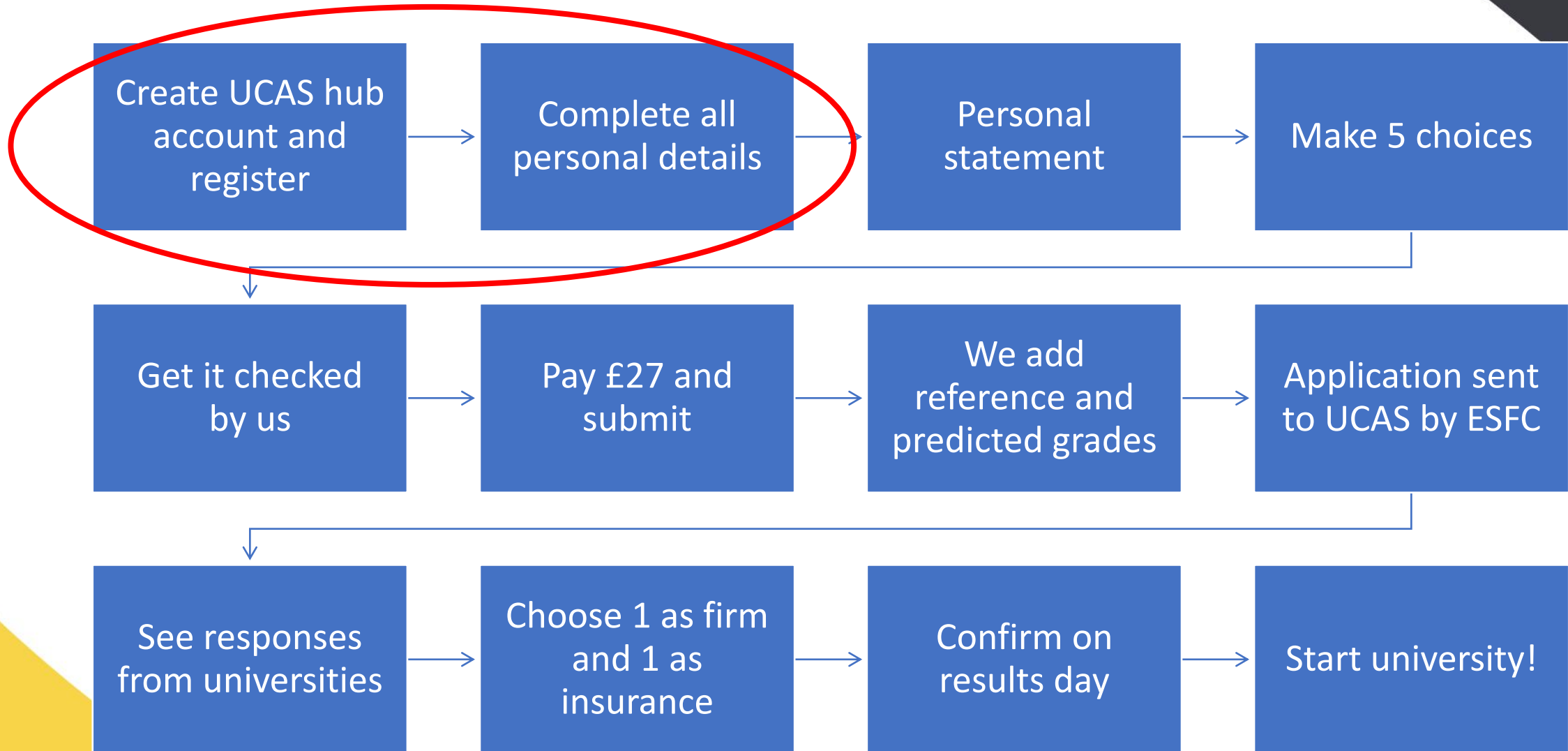

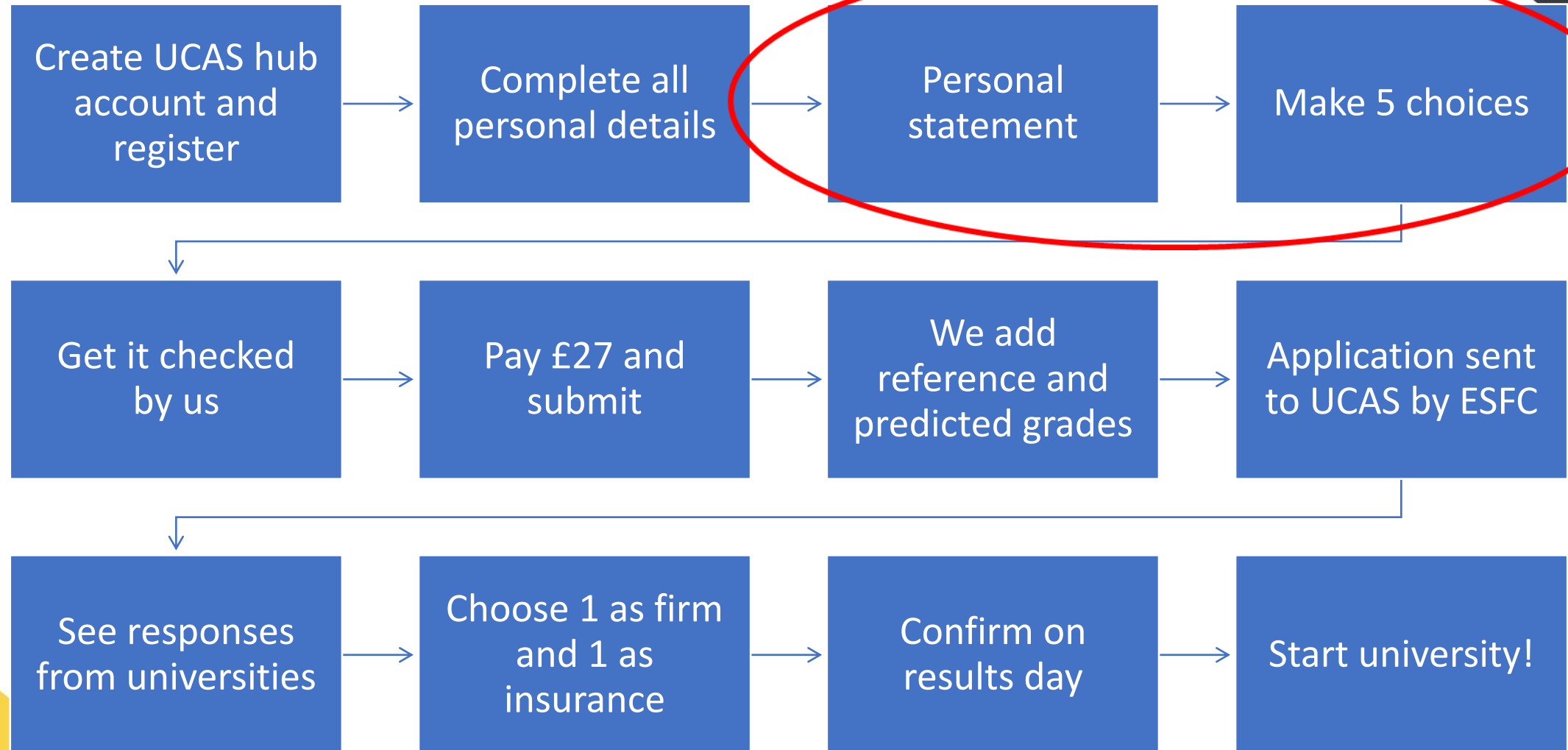

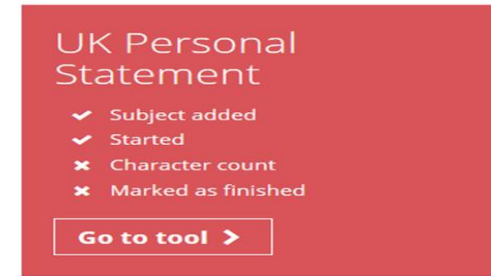


- On **After Esher Day** (20 June 2024)

- Link application to ESFC with a **buzzword**
- Complete all **personal details** (*harder than you think!*)

How does Esher SFC support students?



Personal statement



- No changes to personal statement for 2025
- Use **personal statement** tool on Unifrog
- Every draft saved so tutor can see it to give feedback
- **75-80%** of statement needs to be focused on academic and other skills, with evidence
- **Super-curricular** activities are most valuable if they provide **evidence of skills**
- Students will get input on this on **After Esher Day**
- Parents' talk online in the summer term
- First part of 6.2 autumn term tutorial sessions are focused on PS

What do universities find out from the PS?

- Have they chosen the **right subject** for the right reasons?
- Do they know what **studying the subject** actually involves?
- Do they have real **academic** or **vocational interest** in the subject – evidence?
- Are they **motivated and committed** and can they study **independently**?
- Do they possess good **numeracy** and **literacy** skills?
- Do they possess relevant **'soft skills'** – team work, leadership, resilience, problem solving etc? (*Work experience or The Internship will provide excellent evidence for these.*)

Beware!



Do not be tempted to ‘buy’ a personal statement – plagiarism software will detect

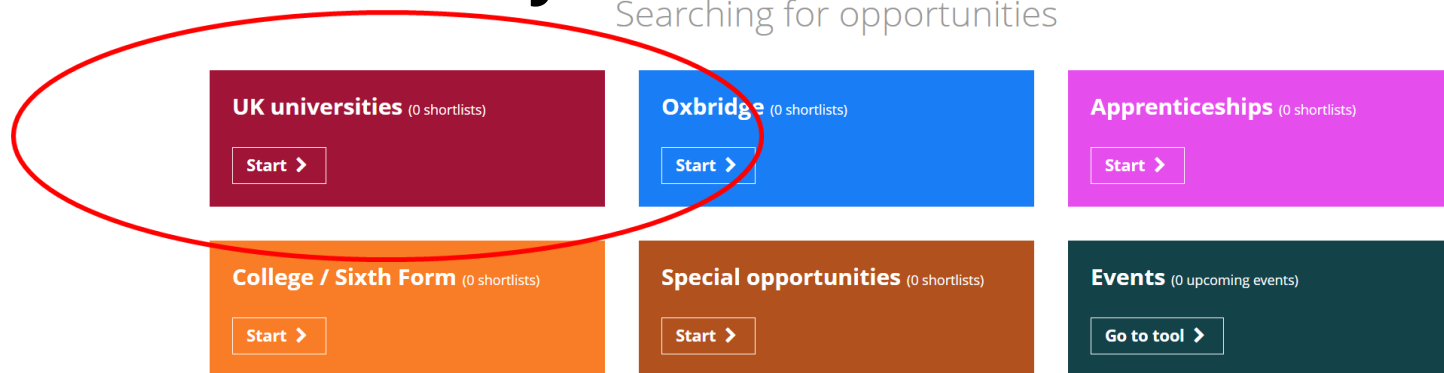
AI **can** be used responsibly to provide a framework – however it can produce vague, inaccurate material

It is a **personal** statement



Help to choose

- **5** choices – except for medicine and vets (4 +1)
- **Cannot** change your mind once form is submitted (until Extra opens in Feb)
- Advice: 2 or 3 **aspirational**, 1 or 2 **solid** and 1 **safe**
- If you are very aspirational you might be disappointed
- **Historic entry grades data** can be very useful – UCAS are making this available to students (est date – May 2024); Unifrog 'UK Universities tool'
- Subjects and institutions **vary** – research is **essential**

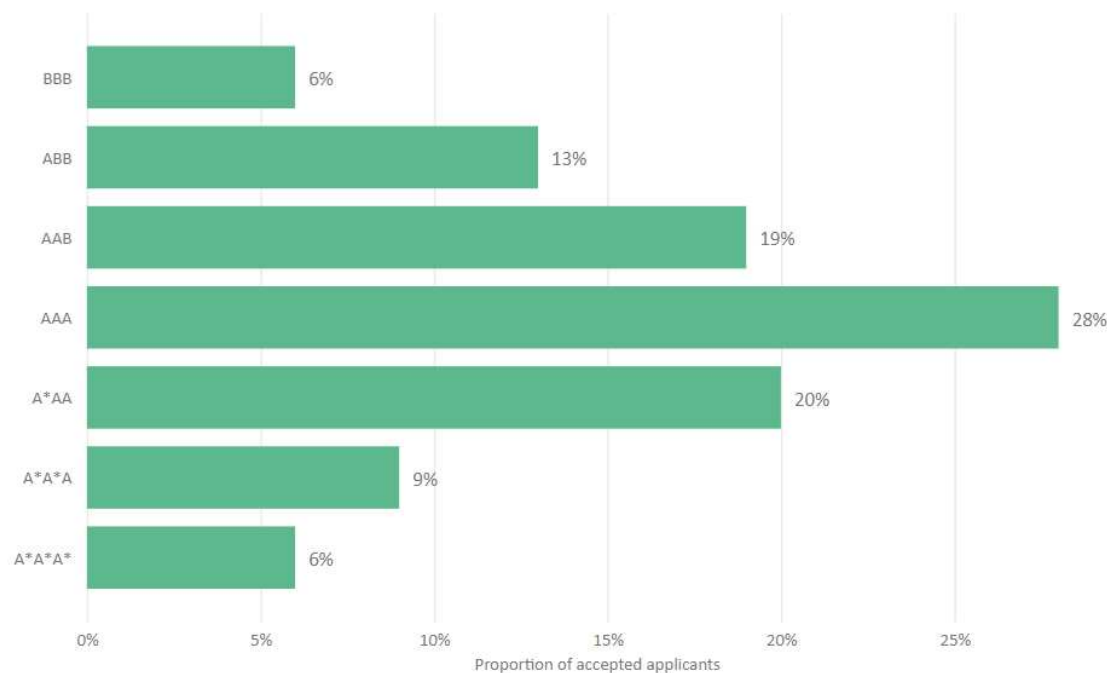



UCAS Historic entry data tool – new for 2025 cycle

- Published **entry requirement** may be different to **grades on entry**
- Modern Languages at Leeds: offer ABB; only 42% of students starting gained this grade or above
- Maths at Imperial College, London: offer A*A*A; All students met or exceeded this (80% of students had A*A*A*!)
- Fashion Marketing and Comms at AUB: offer 120 Ucas points; 52% met or exceeded this
- Use UCAS **historic entry grades data tool** or **Unifrog UK Universities too** to help

- **Unifrog** is our main research tool
- Unifrog was launched to students before Christmas
- Unifrog parent form code: **COJBparents** (*only valid for 90 days from 14/03/24*)



The BSc (Hons) Psychology degree aims to provide students with a strong foundation of knowledge and expertise within the subject. The degree is taught by research-active academics with specialist areas of expertise including cognitive neuropsychology, vision and attentional processing, infant cognition and language, mental health, forensic psychology and life span development. Students are encouraged to participate in original research projects with staff throughout the course, and may have the opportunity to publish and present findings. Students have the opportunity to learn through a combination of theoretical, lecture-based teaching, small group seminar discussion and practical experimentation.

UCAS grades

- We add predicted grades (**UCAS grades**)
- Based on a variety of information, but especially **6.1 Formal Exams**
- UCAS grades released on student and parent portal on **26 June**
- Students should apply aspirationally but not unrealistically!

What do the universities do?

- **Sometimes** additional tests, interviews, auditions, portfolios necessary
- Unis make **offers** or **rejections** – ongoing until May
- Offers - **grades** or UCAS **tariff points**
- **Students decide which offers to accept** and reject the others – by early June
- **Firm** offer – top / best / most aspirational
- **Insurance** offer - usually lower or more flexible
- If **5 rejections or mind-changers** - **UCAS Extra** from February until they receive an offer from somewhere / until clearing opens

Confirmation and Clearing

- Results issued in **mid August**; offers are confirmed on Results Day
- If student **meets** firm offer they go to their **firm choice** university
- If student **misses** firm offer but **meets conditional offer** they go to their **insurance choice** university
- If they miss both, they are automatically in **Clearing**

Confirmation and Clearing

- Students can also enter **Clearing** by releasing themselves
- Students can apply '**Direct to clearing**' on results day, if places available
- Students can also **withdraw and re-apply** the following year for other courses or places
- Can't hold a deferred place in one round and reapply for a 'better' place in the next

Esher College Dates and Deadlines

- All **deadlines for 2025 entry** are in the parents' information sheet
- They may seem early but...
- Lots of **checking** of the form necessary
- Over **900 forms** sent from Esher in last cycle
- **Most** universities will accept late forms but are not obliged to consider them

- Presentation on applying to Oxbridge at Higher Education Day next week
- **Encouragement** of potential students already taking place
- Online and in-person **talks, conferences and visits**
- **Open Days** in July
- **Early deadline**, tests, interviews etc
- Typical GCSE profile **8 x grades 8-9s**
- Typical A level offer **A*AA, typical achievement A*A*A**

Art / Art Foundation Applications

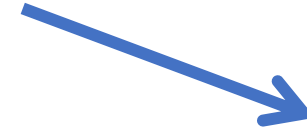
- **James** Leonard - Art Foundation Coordinator
- Individual applications to **each** art college separately
- Foundation course - a one year diagnostic **pre-degree** course
- Separate system to UCAS and students may apply to both
- **No tuition fees** for students under 19 at start of course
- **Creative Arts Portfolio** progression pathway or creative **EPQ**
