

What are Oxbridge looking for?



- high grades: Oxford between AAA and A*A*A* depending on your course. For Cambridge A*AA (Humanities) and A*A*A (Sciences) is needed.
- success in admission tests, where applicable
- a real, genuine and heartfelt interest in their subject and an inquisitive approach
- more than just the ability to read and regurgitate information critical thinkers needed
- to be able to open up and to talk intelligently at interviewfield questions, solve problems (especially in Maths and Science applications) and think on your feet

Foundation Year



- Oxford and Cambridge now offer a Foundation year course as a pre cursor to a degree
- Successful completion leads to a place on a full degree course
- One-year fully-funded foundation programme for UK state school students with significant academic potential, who have experienced severe personal disadvantage and/or disrupted education

How do Oxford and Cambridge identify suitable candidates?




- Academic achievement (GCSE grades + predicted A level grades)

- Personal statement
- Admissions tests
- Submission of written work from your A level course
- Interview(s)
- Contextual data (Supplementary Application Questionnaire at Cambridge)

Oxbridge 'elitism' - House of Commons Library (parliament.uk)




Current situation at Esher 2024 applications

- 7 from Cambridge: History, English, Psychology, Philosophy, Engineering, Chemical Engineering, Human Social and Political Sciences (HSPS)

How do we support students here at Esher?



- High Achievers Programme September 6.1 year onwards
- Summer term workshops on the application process
- Small subject-specific groups led by a subject mentor in summer term of 6.1 year
- 1:1 support for personal statement writing
- 1:1s with subject mentor and Oxbridge Co-ordinator in Autumn term 6.2 year
- Mock assessments and interviews in the autumn term
- Interview bootcamp with Reigate College
- Post offer mentoring

What can you do as parents?



- Support, encourage and help your child source wider research and reading around their subject nourish the nerd in them!
- Ask your child about their research, give them opportunities to discuss it with you.
- Accompany on open days
- Source and print practice papers of the University Admissions Tests
- During the summer, help them sit papers under test conditions.



What is your plan B?

- Application is highly competitive
- National offer rate is approximately 1 offer for every 6 applicants
- Esher current offer rate this year is 1 offer for every 4 applicants
- STUDENTS NEED A PLAN B- MUST BE HAPPY TO GIVE IT A GO AND ACCEPT REJECTION IF IT COMES!
- The process itself is useful for the future
